“**Towards Greater Corporate Responsibility – Conclusions of EU-funded Research**” was published by the European Commission. This policy review examines the results of socio-economic research projects on Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funded under the European Union’s Sixth Framework Programme for Research and Technological Development. The publication looks at the research undertaken with a view to developing a general concept of Corporate Social Responsibility, as well as evolving specific European Union policy in this area. Useful information

- From 2011 onwards, research under the SSH programme will be following an overall integrated “**Strategic Research Roadmap**” covering the period 2011-2013. It should enable a better and comprehensive planning and coordination for the research community as well as for the European Commission. The roadmap is based on the objectives and activities set out in the Specific Programme “Cooperation”. It takes into account the topics covered within previous work programmes and the funded projects within the activities. Furthermore current policy developments and policy needs are taken into account. The roadmap identifies major “Societal Challenges” that have to be tackled in a medium to long term perspective and/or “Topics” that in general will be approached by small-medium scale focused research projects or coordination and support actions that strive at either addressing urgent needs or complementing the research agenda of the societal challenges. - The European Commission launches consultation on "**EU 2020: a new strategy to make the EU a smarter, greener social market**" on giving the EU economy a brighter future through the EU 2020 Strategy. EU 2020 aims to deliver greener and socially inclusive growth, as outlined by President Barroso in his Political Guidelines. The new Strategy will build on the achievements of the Lisbon Strategy, while learning its lessons. The consultation paper sets out a vision for how EU 2020 will focus on entrenching recovery from the crisis, helping to prevent a similar one in future and on three thematic objectives: creating value through knowledge; empowering people in inclusive societies; and creating a competitive, connected and greener economy. - The EC opened **a new archive of FP Programme Evaluation and Monitoring Documents**. This archive contains the evaluation and monitoring reports of successive Framework Programmes, as well as the individual evaluation studies on thematic and other research activities within these Framework Programmes which were carried out by the Directorate-General for Research at the European Commission. In addition the archive contains key background documents on the creation and development of the Framework Programme and on the European Commission's research evaluation system. - The European Commission has revised the general model grant agreement for use in research projects funded under the 7th Framework Programme. The changes reflect the new Lisbon Treaty, and in particular Article I which states that "the Union shall replace and succeed the European Community;" otherwise the grant agreement and its annexes remain unchanged.
- On 18 December 2009, the EC adopted some modifications to the FP7 Model Grant Agreement. Changes have been made to Articles II.15.2 c and II.16.1 of Annex II of the Model Grant Agreement and concern beneficiaries whose status changes during the life of a project. Such a change will now no longer affect the EC contribution rate or the indirect cost rate as it would have previously done. Beneficiaries who change their status during a project will continue to benefit from the rates that applied at the start of the project.
