Collaboration between NET4SOCIETY and PLATON+ project

NET4SOCIETY and PLATON+ projects joined forces at the "Research Connection 2009" conference that was held on 7-8 May 2009 in Prague.

PLATON+ and **NET4SOCIETY** both have the objective of bringing Socio-economic Sciences and Humanities to the forefront of EU-funded research

while also stressing the importance of social sciences and humanities as a crucial part in producing knowledge in other research disciplines and in policy making. Visitors of the conference "Research Connection" were invited to jump into the world of social sciences, economics and

humanities at the "Crossing Borders" booth.

PLATON+ and NET4SOCIETY joined forces in order to raise awareness about research potential and research findings in the fields of social sciences and humanities among researchers from other fields, policy makers as well as the business community and NGOs.

At "Research Connection 2009" in Prague, visitors were invited to talk about their interfaces with socio-economic research and to use the presence of both projects for exchanging ideas and perspectives on fruitful interdisciplinary cooperation and use of socio-economic knowledge.

At the booth, visitors were provided with information (policy briefs and working papers about different social key issues) from ongoing and recently finished EU-projects.



Calls

- The next call of SSH is expected to be published in the end of July 2009.
- Next Research Infrastructures call (FP7-INFRASTRUCTURES-2010-1) will contain several topics in the field of Social Sciences and Humanities. This call is expected to be published on 30 July 2009 with a deadline on 3 December 2009. The topics are:
 - European Social Survey (ESS).
 - Survey of Health, Ageing and Retirement in Europe (SHARE).
 - European Social Science Data Archives (CESSDA) and remote access to Official Statistics.
 - Archives for Historical research.
 - Towards a European Research Infrastructure for Modelling & Methodologies.
 - Research Infrastructures for the study of globalization and European integration.
- Next Security call (**FP7-SEC-2010-1**) will contain topics relating Citizens and Security. This call will be published later on this year. the topics are:
 - Signs of 'early warning' to detect trends and weak signals in social polarisation, radicalisation development and segregation
 - Develop models and tools to detect and evaluate risks of terrorism and crime.
 - Reduction of the risk for cognitive biases in intelligence analysis
 - Developing a reference framework for the European security culture: the perception of threats and the trust in public authorities and the police and the perception of security as a service.
 - Foresight-ing the contribution of security research to meet the future EU roles
 - Research on rigorous methodologies for assessment of security investments and trade-off between security and other societal objectives (e.g. privacy and social cohesion).
 - Cost-benefit analysis of the present and future security measures in Europe
 - Review existing codes of conduct, best practises, etc. as to the ethical use of security technologies and the corresponding legal requirements.
 - Use of smart surveillance systems, data protection, integrity and sharing information within privacy rules
