<b>Short Call Abstract:</b>	<p>Research into strategies, methodologies and tools to protect and manage the tangible and intangible components of our cultural heritage is crucial for future economic, social and cultural development.</p> <p>Improving sustainable access to heritage will contribute the well-being and resilience of our societies, as heritage in Europe can promote social cohesion, regeneration, cultural and economic growth. The past is the key to our futures.</p> <p>The field needs to explore novel methods to include cultural and social values in heritage management, and to engage diverse publics and raise awareness of issues related to the protection and value – in its broadest sense - of cultural heritage. In particular, this call is intended to stimulate new conservation management strategies involving local communities, and/or co-creation policies that use the available knowledge and capacity in society.</p> <p>New quantitative, qualitative and mixed method approaches to ascertain how diverse audiences value layered heritages and how modes of access and conservation influences these values and attributes.</p>

<b>Short Call Abstract:</b>	<p>SOLSTICE seeks interdisciplinary contributions from consortia led by Social Sciences and Humanities who will address societal aspects of climate change. Given the pressing nature of global climate change, SOLSTICE aims at producing knowledge that can have an impact on society and policy; impact should not be limited to scientific publications, but should have the potential to trigger change in behavior and attitudes at any level of society.</p> <p>The call will address three themes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Social justice and participation</li> <li>• Sense making, cultural meaning and risk perceptions</li> <li>• Transformative finance and economy</li> </ul>

<b>Short Call Abstract:</b>	Food systems comprise activities for food production, processing and packaging, distribution and retail, as well as consumption. Various factors, like environmental and socio-economic drivers, have influence on the system and therefore, different approaches can increase the sustainability of such a complex network. In the Joint Call, we will support research projects taking a system approach considering, as far as possible, all relevant aspects in the food system and their potential to increase its sustainability (Topic 1). Promoting the diversity within food systems is crucial for ensuring healthy and sustainable diets, strengthening resilience and enhancing socio-economic and environmental benefits (Topic 2). A significant number of valuable ingredients are destroyed during the processing of a food product, hence through mild food processing we aim to preserve the ingredients and to provide high quality, healthy and sustainable food (including organic) to the consumers (Topic 3). A major challenge food systems have to face is the increasing amount of plastic, and the need to prevent food waste and food loss. The idea underlying the development of smart packaging is to protect the food product and reduce waste before spoilage – e.g. by visualising the quality of food via packaging or by applying environmentally friendly resources (Topic 4).

<b>Short Call Abstract:</b>	The purpose of this call for proposals is to fund projects that are designed to support sub-Saharan African countries to establish and/or develop robust national medicines regulatory systems and capacities for ethical review of clinical research and use of medicinal products and technologies in humans, as well as national and international collaboration in compliance with established, internationally acceptable good practices. This scheme targets projects with the active involvement of NECs and/or NRAs from countries with both weak and strong ethics and regulatory capacities in sub-Saharan Africa.
